Current Services

- One 24/7 ambulance with one paramedic and one EMT
- Two weekday daytime firefighters
- Nights and weekends entirely volunteer

Proposed fire district services

- Two 24/7 ambulances, both with one paramedic and one EMT
- Four 24/7 firefighters
- Two weekday daytime firefighters

Why do we need a fire district?

- Increasing population = increasing call numbers
 - EMS 2010 = 631 runs EMS 2022 = 1321 runs
 - Fire 2010 = 271 runs Fire 2022 = 638 runs

Fire response times

- With on duty firefighters = 90 seconds
- With volunteers = 8-10 minutes

How is the district funded?

- Current fire tax = \$0.0632/\$100 of assessed value
- Fire district tax = \$0.1912/\$100 of assessed value
- Current tax comes off when new tax starts, as does ladder truck loan of \$0.0084, making a net difference of \$0.1196/\$100 of assessed value (7.7% increase)
